Big Sky Care Connect Partners with Industry Leader SCL Health Expanding HIE Network

Connection brings three hospitals, 48 primary care and specialty clinics into Montana's HIE

Helena, Mont. — Big Sky Care Connect (BSCC), Montana's newly-formed health information exchange (HIE), today announced that Sister of Charity of Leavenworth (SCL) Health's Montana-area hospitals have successfully connected to its network.

"SCL Health is a key partner for Big Sky Care Connect," said BSCC Chief Administrative Officer Ben Tyrrell. "A significant number of Montanans rely on SCL Health for their medical needs. We are thrilled that their patients and providers will now benefit from the BSCC network through the enhanced ability to track individual medical needs, which can prevent repeat hospitalizations and redundant testing."

As one of the state's largest healthcare delivery systems, SCL Health brings three hospitals and 48 SCL Health Medical Group primary care and specialty clinics to share data and improve access to critical information across the state. The three hospitals that will be connected to the BSCC HIE network include St. James Healthcare in Butte, St. Vincent Healthcare in Billings, and Holy Rosary Healthcare in Miles City. Combined, the SCL Health hospitals and clinics provided care to more than 127,000 Montanans and reported more than 50,000 emergency room visits; 535,000 outpatient and clinic visits; and 15,000 inpatient hospitalizations last year.

BSCC's partnership with SCL Health continues the substantial growth in the HIE's number of valued partnerships across the state since its launch in fall 2020. BSCC currently has over 230 participating locations with 95 currently contributing data.

Before the launch of BSCC, Montana was one of just two states without a state-designated HIE. An HIE is a modern system for improving health and saving time by feeding data from health care providers across the state into a centralized digital network. As Montana's statewide HIE,

health care organizations of all types across the state have the opportunity to participate in the network.

Clinics that participate in BSCC gain an advantage with real-time access to vital medical records. Funding is available for connection costs.
